

The performances of the participants were evaluated by a panel of experts, including Dr. Mufti Mudasir from the Department of English at the University of Kashmir, Mr. Aijazulhaq from EMMRC, and Mr. Bashir Ahmed, a member of the IIPA J&K Chapter.

In his inaugural address, Dr. Nisar A Mir emphasized the university's commitment to student welfare, pledging to provide necessary facilities and infrastructure both inside and outside the classroom. 
