The University of Kashmir, Srinagar (India) and Shinawatra University in Pathumthani Thailand, sign this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) today on 12th January 2013, with the objective of facilitating mutual cooperation, for the promotion of Academic Excellence. The areas of collaboration shall be as under: -

Article-1 (Academic/Research Collaboration):

- a) The Universities shall collaborate and support, each other academically, by conducting joint academic activities for smooth and effective management of their respective Departments/Centres/Courses.
- b) The Universities, shall collaborate with each other in the following fields for promotion of quality research work:
 - i) Undertake Joint Research Projects and allow joint supervision of research programmes (Ph.D).
 - ii) Conduct Conferences/workshops/seminars jointly where faculty members from the Universities would be encouraged to participate.

Article-2 (Faculty/Student Exchange Programmes):

- a) The Universities shall encourage/support faculty exchange programmes that are mutually beneficial and helpful for faculty members and the Universities.
- b) The Universities shall sponsor visits by Faculty members for a brief period for interaction with teachers/scholars and for delivering extension lectures according to the details to be mutually agreed upon.
- c) The Universities shall encourage/support exchange programmes for research scholars to enable them to use infrastructural facilities available in each other's Universities and to interact/learn from experienced faculties at the Universities.
- d) The Universities shall allow scholars/students to attend classes/seminars in each other's Universities according to details that will be mutually agreed upon.

Article-3 (Universities Obligations):

- a) The Universities agree to provide access to the faculty/students to their libraries, archives, research laboratories and other facilities.
- b) The Universities agree to provide access to high-end instruments and equipments to each other's faculty scholars students as and when desired.

- c) The Universities shall encourage faculty/scholars/students to visit each other's Universities conducting research/talent promotion programmes/other academic activities.
- d) The Universities shall share knowledge/information and publications/ magazines/liter essential for the academic pursuit.
- e) The Universities agree to provide accommodation to the visiting faculty members/scholars at subsidized rates on the university campuses as and when required.

Article-4 (Operationalisation of the MOU):

- a) If any of the visiting student, scholar or faculty members commits any kind of impropriety at host institute during the period of his/her visit, the facilities offered to him/her shall be immediately withdrawn and he/she shall be sent back to his/her parent institution. A report regarding impropriety committed by the concerned shall be forwarded to his/her parent institution initiating necessary disciplinary action under rules;
- b) This MOU shall remain in force for a period of 3 (three) years and further extension shall be subject to review, based on the satisfaction of collaboration expressed by both parties and if both parties feel the need to enter into further collaboration. However, a university can terminate this MOU any time giving three months notice to the other university
- c) The MOU shall be effective from the date it is signed by the University of Kashmir, Srinagar (India) and Shinawatra University, Pathumthani, Thailand.

MoU BETWEEN CSIR 4PI and UNIVERSITY OF KASHMIR

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereinafter referred to as "MOU") is made and entered into on this 30th day of December Two Thousand Thirteen between:

University of Kashmir, located at Hazratbal, Srinagar - 190006, J&K, India represented by its Vice Chancellor (hereinafter called "UoK", which expression shall where the context so admits include its successors and permitted assignees) on the first part;

AND,

Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, a society registered under the Societies Registration Act "(XXI of 1860)" having its registered office at Anusandhan Bhavan, 2, Rafi Marg, New Delhi 110 001, India represented through its constituent laboratory CSIR Fourth Paradigm Institute (formerly CSIR Centre for Mathematical Modelling and Computer Simulation) located at National Aerospace Laboratories, Belur campus, Bengaluru, (hereinafter called "CSIR 4PI", which expression shall where the context so admits include its successors and permitted assignees) on the other part.

Hereinafter, both parts are individually referred to as "**PARTY**" and collectively as "**PARTIES**" in the MoU.

1. Preamble:

Whereas, **University of Kashmir is a multi-faculty University, imparting instruction in various subjects in the Faculty of Arts, Languages, Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, Education, Commerce, Law, Medicine, Dental Surgery, Engineering, Music and Fine Arts and Non-formal Education; and,**

Whereas, **CSIR 4PI is center for data intensive research, mathematical modelling and computer simulation under the aegis of CSIR, Government of India presently working in the areas of Solid Earth Modelling, Ocean and Atmosphere Modelling, Network and Cyber security, Nonlinear Dynamical System and Computational Mechanics with a focus on High Performance Computing to R&D in diverse domains including Data Intensive Research and Scientific Computing using Massively Parallel Supercomputers; and**

Whereas, **Parties agree on the objective of creating a framework for enriching scientific endeavors in mutually agreed fields of research through collaboration in developing and implementing new academic and research programmes and faculty and students exchange. Now therefore, Parties have agreed to come together and have decided to work jointly on the following terms and conditions in certain areas of common interest as listed below:**

- Lithosphere Modelling using Broadband Seismology
- Earthquake Hazard and Risk Assessment
- Crustal Deformation Study
- Climate Change and Atmospheric Modelling
- Network and Cyber security
- Nonlinear Dynamics and Computational Mechanics
- High Performance Scientific and Data Intensive Computing

in addition to all other remedies available in law or equity including monetary damages.

10. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither Parties shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the Force Majeure events such as, but not limited to, the acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes, Lockouts, Epidemic, Riots, Civil commotions etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the Party affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other Party within 30 (Thirty) days of such occurrence or cessation. If the Force Majeure conditions continue beyond 6 (six) months, the Parties shall jointly decide about the future course of action.




11. GOVERNING LAWS AND DISPUTES RESOLUTION

This MoU shall, in all respects, be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India.


This MoU is to create a framework for enriching scientific endeavours in mutually agreed fields of research through collaboration in developing and implementing new academic and research programmes and faculty and students exchange. Hence any question, doubt or dispute arising out of the interpretation of any term or usage herein or on the implementation and functioning of the various understandings forming a part of this MoU shall be resolved by the Heads of the two organizations or their authorized representatives for the purpose mentioned herein by discussions and negotiations based on consensus in the spirit of developing and strengthening the mutual relationships. Any unresolved dispute if any, shall be referred to Sole Arbitrator in accordance with Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and rules framed thereof. Arbitrator shall be appointed on mutual consent of Parties. Arbitration shall be conducted at Bengaluru in English language. The decision of arbitrator so reached shall be final and binding on both the parties.



MEMORANDIUM OF UNDERSTANDING IN DUPLICATE (MoU)

National Council for Promotion of Urdu Language, (Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Govt, of India,) FC-33/9. Farogh-e-Urdu Bhawan, Institutional Area, Jasola, New Delhi (hereinafter called NCPUL) and Directorate of Lifelong Learning, University of Kashmir, Srinagar, J & K, (State University) (hereinafter called DLL, University of Kashmir, Srinagar) sign this MOU with the objective of facilitating mutual cooperation for launching multiple professional vocational courses for the youth in Kashmir for their skill development. The provisions of the MOU shall be as under;

Article -1(Courses to be Launched)

NCPUL and DLL, University of Kashmir, New Delhi shall launch the following need based vocational courses under the **Skill Development and Training Centre** towards increasing awareness, knowledge, skill and employability of the youth.

1. Certificate Course in Paper Machie
2. Certificate/ Diploma Course in Tourism and Travel Management
3. Any other course(s) to be launched with mutual consent.

The above mentioned courses or any other course shall be launched by the NCPUL and DLL in collaboration in phased manner in due course of time on mutually agreed terms and conditions.

Article -2 (Responsibility of the DLL, University of Kashmir):

- DLL will conduct courses and act as a nodal agency for the implementation of the courses of NCPUL in Kashmir.
- DLL shall Supervise and monitor all NCPUL's Skill Development and Training Centres.



- DLL shall make publicity of the course through local media. If DLL desire, the services of media partner/s of NCPUL can be utilized.
- DLL shall design syllabus/course material etc. for conduct of the course.
- DLL shall facilitate to implement the Certificate/ Diploma Course in Urdu Language of NCPUL at all Skill Development and Training Centres in Jammu and Kashmir.
- DLL shall conduct examination and certification of the candidates as per Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) prepared jointly by the both Organizations i.e. NCPUL and DLL.
- DLL shall arrange/engage faculties for conducting the courses in consultation with NCPUL as per following qualifications:

- The Director, DLL shall be the Chief Project coordinator of the Project at University of Kashmir. He/She will open and maintain a separate account relating to the all financial matters and will submit duly audited certificate from time to time related to NCPUL's schemes.
- Director, DLL (Chief Project coordinator) shall nominate a Coordinator for liaisoning and smooth functioning of courses.

Article 3 (Responsibility of NCPUL):

- NCPUL will bear the expenses of the approved head for conducting vocational courses.
- NCPUL shall release payment under approved heads in advance quarterly and Director, DLL shall submit quarterly Utilization Certificate along with progress report of the preceding quarter to the NCPUL.
- NCPUL shall pay administrative charges @ 12.5% on the approved budget which will be utilized by the DLL on activities like Accreditation, Assessment & Certification, stationary, infrastructural facilities (mating, furniture etc.), Travel expenses, Honorarium to the expert and Chief coordinator, Coordinator/ including staff at DLL involved in the project during training and other activities related to smooth functioning of the courses.

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4. NCPUL shall bear all statutory taxes, duties, levies, cess etc., if applicable by Govt. /Local bodies, from time to time if any incurred in excess of allotted fund on purchase of raw material.



Article 4 (OTHER TERMS & CONDITIONS)

- i. Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) to run vocational courses will be prepared jointly by NCPUL and DLL.
- ii. Identification of the training centres for running the vocational courses shall be made mutually by DLL and NCPUL.
- iii. Selection, supervision and monitoring of the Skill Development and Training Centres will be done jointly by the NCPUL and DLL.
- iv. All disputes or differences whatsoever, arising between the parties out of or relating to the construction, meaning, operation or effect of this MOU or breach thereof, shall be settled mutually. If anything does not settle mutually, then the matter will be referred to the sole Arbitrator appointed by the Secretary, MHRD, in terms of the Arbitration and conciliation Act, 1996.
- v. Neither NCPUL nor DLL, University of Kashmir shall be liable to the other for any delay in or failure of performance of their respective obligations under this agreement caused by occurrences beyond the control of NCPUL or University of Kashmir.
- vi. The parties of the agreement would strive to discharge their obligations under this contract with due diligence.
- vii. The legal disputes if any, between the parties, shall be subject to jurisdiction of appropriate courts at New Delhi. In witness whereof the parties hereto have executed this agreement in duplicate on the day and the year herein after indicated.

- viii. The MOU will be valid for a period of 5 Years subject to annual review by both the parties and further extendable on mutually agreed terms. Any of the provisions of this MOU can be amended/revised or terminated on mutual consent of both the parties. However, each party will have the right to terminate the agreement anytime by giving an advance notice of minimum 3 months.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

For Educational Exchange

Between

University of Kashmir, Srinagar, India

And

Management Development Institute, Gurgaon, India

Article-1 (Preamble)

University of Kashmir, Srinagar (UOKS) was founded in 1948 and was bifurcated in 1969 into two full-fledged universities: University of Kashmir at Kashmir and University of Jammu at Jammu. In 2002 the University of Kashmir was accredited as Grade-A University by the National Accreditation & Assessment Council (NAAC) of the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi. It was re-accredited as Grade-A University by the NAAC in 2011.

The Main Campus of the University is situated at Hazratbal in Srinagar over 247-acres of land. It is flanked by the world famous Dal Lake on its eastern side and Nigeen Lake on the western side, and has a right kind of atmosphere for serious study and research. The University is committed to provide an intellectually stimulating environment for productive learning and instructional programmes to enhance the educational, economic, scientific, business and cultural environment of the region. Since its inception, the University has been developing at a reasonably fast pace with all the major faculties having come up over the years.

Management Development Institute, Gurgaon, India (MDI) is an autonomous, non-governmental, not-for-profit organisation created in 1973, duly established under the provisions of Indian legal system. MDI provides long-term education programmes at the postgraduate level, continuing education courses, consulting services and research facilities.

In pursuit of common interests in teaching and research, UOKS (hereinafter also referred to as home institution) and MDI (hereinafter also referred to as host institution), agree to partner in a co-operation program aimed at facilitating interactions between the two institutions. This program shall be guided by the following provisions of the agreement.

Article-2 (Objective)

The co-operation program aims to foster advancement in teaching, research, cultural understanding, as well as international reputations of both institutions in general and through a specific project involving nomination of MBA students by the home institution to the "MDI International Summer University programme" of host institution and other academic exchanges in terms of nomination of members of academic staff of UOKS to various training and development programmes of MDI that both institutions agree to.



Article-3
(Scope of cooperation)

1. With the idea of reaching out to University students pursuing an MBA degree from a duly established State or Central University within India as well as to the students at any of its international partner institutions all over the world, host institution is offering a 'MDI International SUMMER UNIVERSITY' beginning 2013. This is proposed to be an annual event. Host institution agrees to accept bona fide students of home institution to participate in the above said event as stated in the following terms.
2. Host Institution will accept only postgraduate students (MBA) from the home institution, starting in the academic year 2012-13 to participate in the "MDI International Summer University 2013." Nominated students will not spend more than duration of this event at the host institution.
3. Home institution can nominate up to 4 (four) of its students to participate in the event and host institution agrees to accept these students to attend the event. Upon mutual agreement, additional students can participate provided that the host institution agrees to accept more nominations.
4. The students so nominated must be enrolled in the 2-year full time MBA programme of home institution and must have completed at least one year of their designated course work by the time they come to attend the event. In order to be successful at the event, home institution must ensure that the nominee students have very good English language skills and are top performers in the MBA programme.
5. Applicants from home institution will fill out application forms of the host institution. Students will be pre-selected by their home institutions with final acceptance made by the host institution. The host institution may refuse, with or without cause, to accept any pre-selected student, and the host institution shall not be liable for damages to the home institution as a result of the host institution's refusal to accept any pre-selected student. However, admissions decisions will generally depend on home institutions' recommendations. Notwithstanding the foregoing, home institution and host institution agree not to discriminate on the basis of race, creed, sex, or national origin in the decision of whether to accept a pre-selected student.
6. Host Institution shall announce the schedule of fees and charges for every year. The charges are likely to be revised upwards in the following years to reflect for the general inflation. The charges payable for the Summer University 2013 are expected to be:
 - a. Rs. 10000/- towards the cost of instruction for each course.
 - b. Rs. 1000/- per week for boarding upto a maximum of 4 weeks. (Superior options at higher prices may be available)
 - c. Rs. 1000/- per week for lodging upto a maximum of 4-weeks. (Superior options at higher prices may be available)
7. Students desiring to opt for such courses and whose nominations have been accepted will pay the instructional fee and the boarding/lodging charges to host institution. No student can participate in the Summer University until the full fee/charges have been paid to the host institution.
8. One nominated student can opt for a maximum of two courses from amongst a minimum of nine courses that will be on offer. Host institution shall have the right to withdraw a course on offer if there is insufficient interest for that course.

9. Home institution students will be considered as regular students at host institution for the duration of the event, with grades determined in accordance with prevailing standards at host institution. All academic records will be kept confidential with access open only to the student and the designated offices at the two institutions.
10. Home institution will allow full credit transfer for approved subjects successfully completed by its students at host institution. These grades will be accepted by home institution towards the requirements of grant of MBA degrees by the home institution.
11. All summer university students will stay on campus at MDI, Gurgaon for a period of three weeks or thereabouts as per the schedule. They would abide by the rules and regulations of the MDI campus and shall confirm to the residential disciplinary rules of MDI campus.
12. Home institution students participating in the event will not be eligible for any other benefits or rights of affiliations save as may be stated here. They will not be eligible to seek placement assistance from host institution.
13. Home institution and host institution can make use of this MOU in their publicity and brand communications but cannot use the logos or elements of brand identity of each other in such matters.
14. Other Academic Activities
 - a. Depending on the need, home institution and host institution may formulate other mutually beneficial academic exchange programs based on requests from home institution and host institution. Both the institutions will jointly promote more contacts and co-operation between their faculty members.
 - b. Under this agreement partner institutions may invite faculty members from the other partner institution to teach part of a course or a full course or for participation in a research project. The Heads of both Schools will work out the release of the faculty members under the exchange program. The resource commitments for such exchange will be agreed upon on a case-by-case basis.
 - c. Home institution and host institution may develop joint-certification and joint-degree programs through consortium arrangements between themselves or jointly or severally with third parties. This would however not place any restrictions on home institution and host institution to pursue such arrangements with third parties in their respective individual capacities.
 - d. Home institution shall make necessary changes in the existing statutes / policies, if required, for effective implementation of the MOU

Article-4 (Special provisions)

1. The obligations of the parties under this agreement are only for the participants and include neither spouses nor dependants. Those who accompany the participants are the responsibility of the participant.
2. This agreement places no financial obligation on either of the partner institutions. In case of any third party liability arising on to one of the parties due to the actions of the other party to this agreement, the parties hereto agree to indemnify the other fully and completely against such eventualities.




3. This agreement also places no obligations on either of the partner institutions to restrict such arrangements between themselves and both home institution and MDI would continue to enjoy the freedom to pursue other arrangements with other parties.
4. Nothing shall diminish the full autonomy of either institution, nor should any constraints be imposed by either upon the other in carrying out the agreement. Should there be any dispute arising out of this agreement, the VC of home institution and Director of MDI would resolve the same through mutual consultation.

Article-5 (Duration)


1. This Agreement will be in force from the date on which it is signed and will be effective for the duration of three (3) years from the date of signature hereof. The agreement can be renewed thereafter as may be agreed upon by the parties. The home and the host institution would designate a member of their staff to coordinate the mutual activities ensuing as a part of this agreement. Any changes in the designated persons would be communicated to the other party as soon as possible.
2. Any modifications concerning the present Agreement may be made only by mutual consent in writing between the authorised representatives of the parties.
3. Either party may terminate this agreement at any time by giving six months' notice in writing to the other party although such action will only be taken after mutual consultation in order to avoid any possible inconvenience to all concerned. Regardless of termination, the parties shall continue to fulfil their obligations hereunder until all participants who have commenced the program may complete the term in session at the time of termination or the work which is in progress at the time of termination.
4. There are two signed copies of this agreement (comprising of 4 pages). A copy each is retained by the two parties hereto.






After having studied the contents of the research proposal (enclosed), a formal agreement between two Institutions needs to be developed to encourage and study important facets of early history of Kashmir.

1. The Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana hereinafter referred to as "PAU" is a premier institution established in 1962 on the pattern on Land Grant Colleges of the USA. The university has a mission to achieve excellence in research, education and extension programmes in agriculture and allied fields. It has set its goals to provide quality education, undertake basic, applied and adaptive research to seek appropriate solutions to the emerging problems, develop effective mechanism for technology transfer and to develop technologies for supporting growth of agro-based industries and generate self-employment opportunities for the educated youth. The university as first party is committed to forge ties with other institutes/universities in the country and abroad involved in developing quality manpower and research collaborations.

2. University of Kashmir, Srinagar was founded in 1948 and was bifurcated in 1969 into two full fledged universities: University of Kashmir at Srinagar and University of Jammu at Jammu. In 2002 the University of Kashmir was accredited as Grade-A University by the National Accreditation & Assessment Council (NAAC) of the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi. It was re-accredited as Grade -A University by the NAAC in 2011. The Main Campus of University is situated at Hazratbal in Srinagar over 247-acres of land. It is flanked by the world of famous Dal lake on its eastern side and Nigeen Lake on the western side, and has a right kind of atmosphere for research and academic activities. The University is committed to provide an intellectually stimulating environment for productive learning and instructional programmes to enhance the educational, economic, scientific, business and cultural environment of the region. Since its inception, the University has been developing at a reasonably fast pace with all the major faculties having come up over the years.

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) is entered into on 4th day of June, 2014.

BETWEEN

The Punjab Agricultural University (PAU) represented by its Vice-Chancellor, having its office at Ludhiana, Punjab in India hereinafter referred to as the PARTY OF THE FIRST PART.

AND

University of Kashmir, Hazratbal, Srinagar represented by its Vice-Chancellor, having its office at Srinagar, J & K in India hereinafter referred to as the PARTY OF THE SECOND PART.

WITNESS that

WHEREAS, THE Party of the First Part is an educational institution of national importance engaged in advancement of teaching, research and extension activities in various fields of agriculture and allied sciences.

WHEREAS, THE Party of Second Part is also committed to overall scientific and intellectual advancement of society through generation of highly skilled manpower and dissemination of knowledge.

WHEREAS, both party of the First Part and the party of the Second Part have come to an understanding to promote **Linkage and Academic Collaboration**.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY MUTUALLY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE INCLUDING OBJECTIVES

- a) The Universities shall collaborate and support each other academically by conducting joint academic activities, for the benefit of students and faculty
- b) The Universities shall collaborate with each other, in the following field for promotion of quality research work.
 - i) Undertake Joint Research Projects
 - ii) Allow joint supervision of postgraduate research
 - iii) Due credit will be given to the co-guide/supervisor


2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS (These are general guidelines and may need to be modified on case to case basis)

- 1. This MoU is valid for a period 5 years at the first instance, but can be extended with the consent of both the parties.
- 2. This MoU shall be deemed to have been automatically rescinded after the expiry of the MoU period, unless renewed for any further period as per mutually agreed upon terms at a later stage.
- 3. Either of the parties hereto shall be entitled to terminate the MoU at any time with valid reasons acceptable in writing to both parties and in such case, the MoU will terminate six months after the date of written notification or date of expiry of the MoU, whichever is earlier. In case of such premature termination of the MoU, all rights and obligations of both parties shall automatically cease except for those covered by written contract including ongoing collaborative activity that can no longer be cancelled.
- 4. In case of any dispute that may crop-up during executing of MoU, the matter would be settled through arbitration by referring to Arbitration Committee comprising of a member nominated each by two parties and one member will be jointly nominated by two parties.
- 5. All credits and benefits for collaborative work including the intellectual property generated during the tenancy of project would be equally shared between both parties i.e. both parties shall be the joint owners of this IP.


6. Rights for commercialization shall rest jointly with both the parties and shall be decided by co-ordination committee. In case of involvement of private sector, decision will be taken through joint consultation and keeping in view PAU/ICAR guidelines.

Termination


This MOU will be treated as terminated on the happening of any of the events mentioned below.

All disputes and differences between the parties, pertaining to this MOU shall be resolved through mutual discussions.









PREAMBLE

The School of Legal Studies, Central University of Kashmir situated in Kashmir herein after referred to as "SLS CUK" established in early 2009 along with 11 other new Central Universities. It started operating from a rented building in Srinagar city.

The University has now established 11 Departments of 1) Management Studies 2) Tourism Studies 3) Economics 4) Mathematics 5) Education 6) English 7) Urdu 8) Schools of Studies namely School of Business Studies, of Social Sciences, of Physical and Chemical Sciences, of Education, of Linguistics, of Media Studies, of Engineering and Technology and School of Legal studies.

The University is also offering research degree programmes in its departments of English, Management Studies and Law, where it has got already got regular senior level faculty. Presently the University is operating from three different rented building.

Whereas, the second party is the National Law University, Delhi herein referred as "NLU" established in 2008 by Act No. of 2008 of National Capital Territory of Delhi and with the initiative of High Court of Delhi is another law university in the list of premier Law Universities established in India. The vision of the University is to create a global legal institution which will compete with the best outside India and to prepare for a legal career that introduces them to wide range of opportunities in legal profession across the globe. The University's State of Art infrastructure is near completion at Sector 14, Dawarka, and New Delhi with all facilities for best of learning and research.

And the third party is the Faculty of Law University of Kashmir herein referred as "FOL KU". The "FOL KU" is one of the top ranking institutions of the country and has been doing a commendable work in the field of legal education. The "FOL KU" as a seat of learning is located amidst the serene and scenic campus of the University of Kashmir in the lap of the world famous Dal Lake. The "FOL KU" was established way back in the year 1973. Initially LL.B 3 Years course was started followed by LL.M and Ph.D Programs in year 1982. BA.LL.B (5 Year integrated course) was started in the year 2011. The University of Kashmir accredited consecutively A-Grade by NAAC can safely be attributed to the Faculty of Law for its over-all contribution to the level of academic excellence that it has meticulously maintained over the past 40 Years of its existence as the premier institute in the University. Since its inception "FOL KU" has made significant contribution towards the over-all development of the Society. It is the largest Learning and Research Center in the University both in terms of the number of the students and the number of programmes offered. The course curriculum is in line with the Bar Council of India, Legal Education Guidelines, 2008. The department has also introduced the Choice Based Credit System at LL.M level from the year 2015.

Whereas, the SLS, CUK and FOL KU desires to establish academic collaboration with the institutions of excellence in the field of Law, social science and other disciplines in India and other countries abroad, the NLU is one among such recognised institutions and seeks to promote institutional collaborations for academic, research and publication and FOL KU was

adjudged as the best faculty of law compatible with National Law Schools of India by the team of Bar Council of India in its last visit, through this Memorandum of Understanding.

Scope of Agreement

This Memorandum of Understanding is signed between the SLS, CUK as the First Party and the National Law University (NLU), Delhi as Second Party and FOL, KU as third party for the purpose of Academic/ institutional Collaboration that will encompass exchange of students and faculty between the two parties as well as other academic activities, research and publication. In addition to this, active efforts will be made to develop joint training and research programmes that will be pursued in collaborative spirit. The collaboration between the First Party, the Second Party, and the third party shall be subject to following:

I. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF COOPERATION:

1. The SLS, CUK, the NLU, and the FOL KU shall collaborate in mutually agreeable academic events, teaching, training and research, wherever feasible. Such collaboration will be based on mutually agreeable terms and conditions specifically agreed for each of the collaborative efforts;
2. The SLS, CUK, the NLU, and FOL, KU shall offer full time regular as well as optional courses to the undergraduate and post graduate courses offered at these institutions from time to time on mutually agreeable terms and conditions.
3. The Ph. D candidates in interdisciplinary areas of research involving law from the NLU shall work under the supervision of the faculty at doctoral level. The financial implications shall be worked out on a case to case basis;
4. Faculty members from each of these universities shall be invited for important seminars, conferences and for teaching at doctoral level. The financial implications shall be worked out on a case to case basis;
5. Those modalities for a similar exchange of researchers and faculty members will be laid down through mutual discussion that should be made operational for a period of five years;
6. Ph. D Scholars of all the parties shall be allowed to make use of the library resources of each other and to have academic interaction with the faculty;

7. Research Scholars and Teaching Faculty of the SJSU & UIC will explore possibility of taking up collaborative research projects, including the funding from national and international agencies, government and non-government.
8. Any financial implication emerging out of collaborative projects (including the students etc) shall be worked out and decided by the concerned parties in agreement on case to case basis.
9. In case of any dispute that may crop up during execution of this Memorandum, it shall be settled through arbitration to Arbitration Commission of SJSU & UIC, constituted by three parties.

II. AREAS OF COOPERATION

This Memorandum expresses a mutual desire by SJSU & UIC to work together and cooperates in building intellectual and research capacity and to identify the areas of cooperation may be added by written consent of all the parties. The parties will act in good faith to ensure that the objectives in this Memorandum are achieved.

III. TERMS OF AGREEMENT

Progress in realizing the terms and conditions referred to in this Memorandum shall be periodically as mutually agreed and the memorandum may be amended at any time by mutual consent in writing.

IV. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND CONFIDENTIALITY

1. In respect of each project and programmes of co-operation, the parties shall identify and mutually agree in writing on their respective rights to intellectual property and commercial exploitation of the same (including without limitation trademarks and service marks, copyright, patents, designs and confidential information relating there to).
2. Neither party shall, at any time disclose to any third party any confidential information of the other party which is acquired in the course of fulfilling the Memorandum, a collaborative project or a programme, without the prior consent of the other party in writing.

The confidentiality obligations herein will not apply to information in the public domain; information in the possession of the receiving party prior to the disclosure of the information; information which is independently developed by the receiving party; information required to be released by law; and information which is rightfully received by the receiving party from third parties without any breach of confidentiality obligations.

V. NON-BINDING NATURE OF MEMORANDUM




VI. TERMINATION

Within the framework of learning for sustainable development and the current Six Year Plan (2015-21), the Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA) is engaged to undertake activities for Skilling the youth. In pursuit of this objective CEMCA is engaging with Directorate of Lifelong Learning, University of Kashmir, for skilling the youth of Kashmir, especially from marginalised communities with special focus on women in the field of Skill Development. CEMCA seeks to engage Directorate of lifelong learning of University of Kashmir through this contribution agreement as stated below.

1.0 Statement of Activities for DLL, University of Kashmir

1.1.DLL shall:

1.1.1. Mobilize youth such that a total of 250 unemployed youth (50% women) complete the following training course in the following locations and get certified:

- Needle Work(Sozni Art) {2 Courses}(Kashmir University Campus)
- Embroidery/ Crewel Work {1Course} (Bandipora)
- Cutting& Tailoring{2 Courses} (Pulwama, Bandipora)
- Graphic Designing {1 Courses} (Budgam)
- Web Designing {1 Courses} (Budgam)
- Basic Computers with DTP {2 Courses}(Pulwama, Bandipora)

1.1.2. Find means of livelihood for at least 175 youth; earning a minimum of INR 5000 per month after completing the training.



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- 1.1.3. Conduct the orientation workshop;
- 1.1.4. Find a suitable place of training;
- 1.1.5. Create and publish a training calendar to manage the training;
- 1.1.6. Decide on the locations of conducting the Training of Trainer;
- 1.1.7. Provide for training infrastructure in an accessible and appropriate training venue;
- 1.1.8. Supply required tools, equipment and consumables for the training;
- 1.1.9. Engage trainers to train 250+ youth in various job roles and qualification packs;
- 1.1.10. Conduct the training, assessment and certification for the 250+ youth and provide them certificates;
- 1.1.11. Make arrangements (travel, accommodation, per diem) for the all the invited trainers, in case some are based out of station.
- 1.1.12. Create market linkages for the trained candidates such that they can earn their livelihoods
- 1.1.13. Acknowledge CEMCA's contribution by displaying its logo in all banners, and publicity materials.
- 1.1.14. Dedicate resource(s) to manage handling of queries, scheduling of batches, managing logistics etc.
- 1.1.15. Provide periodic updates to CEMCA on a regular basis over the term of the agreement on the status of activities undertaken.
- 1.1.16. Evaluate the outcome of the work performed under this agreement using the following impact indicators:
 - 1.1.16.1. Provide details of the participant trainers like Name, Address, Contact number, etc. for further tracking the trainees;
 - 1.1.16.2. Provide information about impact on level of income of trainees;
 - 1.1.16.3. Help CEMCA conduct before and after training impact assessment from the participants and their trainees without any financial implication on DLL or the university;
 - 1.1.16.4. Provide retention data before and after training intervention;
 - 1.1.16.5. Provide quarterly updates on the number of trainees being trained and certified.



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2.0 CEMCA Contact person

2.1 The Consultant shall liaise on all matters related to this contract with Ms. Sanjogita Mishra (Programme Officer, CEMCA), (sanjogitamishra@col.org).

3.0 Deliverables and Timeframe

3.1. The above agreement shall commence when both parties have signed and a copy has been returned to CEMCA and will continue in effect until 15th June 2018 with the following deliverables and timelines:

- 2.1.1 Conduct orientation workshop latest by Oct 30th, 2017;
- 2.1.2 Register batches of 25-30 youth for each job roles identified by Jan 4th, 2018;
- 2.1.3 Conduct Training of Trainer by Dec 10th 2017;
- 2.1.4 Commence the first batch of training by Jan 4th 2018;
- 2.1.5 Complete training of first three batches latest by Mar 10th 2018;
- 2.1.6 Continuously prepare reports after each intervention of and document learnings for improving the next phase of implementation.
- 2.1.7 prepare a final report of the activity and submit all the deliverable to CEMCA by 15th June, 2018;

4.0 Gender Equality

4.1 Gender equality is integral to all of COL's work and requires that both women's and men's views, interests and needs shape its work in learning for development. The Consultant agrees that gender considerations shall inform the work to be undertaken under this contract.

5.0 CEMCA Responsibilities/ Fees and Invoices

5.1. A maximum contribution of INR 732,000/- (Rupees seven r lakhs thirty-two thousand only) shall be payable to the Consultant in four instalments.

5.2. First instalment of 50% - INR 366,000/- (Rupees three lakh, sixty-six thousand only) will be provided as an advance on signing the contract.

5.3. Second instalment of 30% - INR 219,600/- (Rupees two lakhs nineteen thousand six hundred only) will be provided on having commenced 3 batches of 3 different trades



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5.4. Third instalment of 20% INR 1,46,400/- (Rupees one lakh forty-six thousand four hundred only) will be provided on completion of the project subject to receipt of statement of expenditure duly supported by the original vouchers against all payments made either to individuals or firm or any vendor. If the University requires the vouchers, photocopies may be taken and kept for the purpose of its record.

5.5. The invoice(s) shall contain the contract number, the name and address of the University and the portion of fee due under the contract. The University's bank name, along with bank address, bank number, account name, account number and bank swift code is required to facilitate the direct transfer of funds to the Consultant's bank account.

5.6. If the Consultant fails to deliver satisfactorily any or all goods, services or materials within the time period(s) as specified in the contract, CEMCA reserves the right to amend the fee due under the contract with reference to actual delivery only.

5.7. The invoice should have the PAN details of the University. If it is exempted from direct taxes the fact be mentioned in the invoice.

6.0 Copyright and Intellectual Property

6.1. The University shall assign to COL/CEMCA any copyright arising from the works produced by the Consultant in relation to the services provided while executing the contract.

6.2. COL/CEMCA, as copyright holder, shall hold the unrestricted rights to republish the work in any format at any time including editing the work and associating the work with other work.

6.3. CEMCA agrees that the University has the right to use and adapt the work produced independently of COL/CEMCA, created under a Creative Commons – With Attribution – Share Alike (CC-BY-SA) licence agreement.

6.4. Any background intellectual property belonging to the University as at the date of this contract which is used to provide or be incorporated into the services, will be retained by the University, however, COL/CEMCA will have a non-exclusive right to use this intellectual property as required to fully benefit from the services provided by this contract.

6.5. The University warrants that the use or supply by COL/CEMCA of the work provided by the Consultant under his Contract does not infringe on any intellectual property rights.

6.6. The University agrees that COL/CEMCA will hold the copyright in the intellectual property of any work that is created as a part of this agreement. COL agrees to license the work created under a Creative Commons – With Attribution – Share Alike (CC-BY-SA) licence agreement. 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7.0 Liability and Insurance

7.1. CEMCA shall not assume any liability for any injuries or damage to the University staff and its associates involved with the execution of this contract and shall not assume any responsibility whatsoever for insuring the University staff who are engaged in execution of the activity under this agreement..

7.2. The University shall undertake full responsibility for the purchase of any health and medical, accident or other insurance to the staff who will be carrying out activities under this agreement which may be necessary in respect of any loss, injury, damage or illness occurring during the execution of this contract.

8.0 Termination

8.1 This contribution agreement may be terminated by either party before the expiry date of the agreement by giving written notice to the other party.

8.2 As a result of termination, the University shall have no claim against CEMCA other than payment on a pro rata basis for no more than the actual amount of work performed to the satisfaction of CEMCA.

9.0 Confidentiality

9.1. Any information of a character confidential to the affairs of COL/CEMCA to which the University becomes privy as a result of the work performed under this contract shall be treated as confidential, unless required to do so by law.



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10.0 Assignment

10.1. The University may engage various parties and individuals to complete the assignment. However, vouchers from each of the party engaged has to be submitted to CEMCA.

11.0 Amendments

11.1 This agreement may be amended by a letter of amendment specifying all modifications with the written consent of CEMCA and The University of Kashmir. However, there will be no change in the budget.



This Memorandum of Agreement is executed today on 29th Oct 2016 by and between

NATIONAL ATMOSPHERIC RESEARCH LABORATORY (NARL), Department of Space, Government of India through its Director namely Prof. A. Jayaraman having office at Gadanki Village (PO), Pakala Mandal, Chittoor District, Andhra Pradesh 517112, India, which expression shall include his successor/s in office (hereinafter referred to as the first party)

and

UNIVERSITY OF KASHMIR (UoK), recognized by the University Grants Commission of India and NAAC-A accredited, through its Registrar namely Prof. Musadiq A. Sahaf having office at Hazratbal, Srinagar, Jammu & Kashmir, 190006, India, which expression shall include his successor/s in office (hereinafter referred to as the second party)

1. Preamble

- National Atmospheric Research Laboratory (NARL) at Gadanki near Tirupati in the Chittoor District of Andhra Pradesh is an autonomous research laboratory fully funded by the Department of Space (DOS), Govt. of India and involved in carrying out fundamental and applied researches in Atmospheric and Space Sciences. It had its humble beginning in 1992 as the National Mesosphere-Stratosphere-Troposphere (MST) Radar Facility (NMRF). Over the years several complementary techniques such as Raleigh/Mie lidars, wind profilers, other experimental facilities for measurements of atmospheric aerosols, trace gases and weather modeling systems have been added. NARL is administered by a Governing Council with Secretary, DOS as the Chairman and Director, NARL as the member Secretary. The Governing Council (GC) sets broad policy guidelines for NARL. A Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC) consisting of eminent scientists in the field of atmospheric sciences monitors the research activities and progress of NARL and provides future directions.
- The University of Jammu and Kashmir was founded in the year 1948. In the year 1969, it was bifurcated into two full-fledged Universities: University of Kashmir (UoK) at Srinagar and University of Jammu at Jammu. The University of Kashmir is situated at Hazratbal in Srinagar. Over the years, the University of Kashmir has expanded substantially. It has established satellite Campuses at Anantnag (South Campus) and Baramulla (North Campus) and three more satellite campuses at Kupwara, Kargil and Leh are being established to make higher education more accessible to people living in remote areas of Kashmir valley. The University has also established a sub office at Jammu to cater to the needs of the candidates enrolled with the University from outside Kashmir. Over the years, the University has marched towards excellence in its programs and activities. It has been re-accredited as Grade-A University by the National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) of India in the year 2011. This is a recognition and reflection of the high standard of quality in teaching and research at the University of Kashmir.
- NARL and UoK are individually referred to as 'Party' and collectively as 'Parties.'
- Whereas, NARL and UoK are interested in establishing collaborative research works in the field of atmospheric, ionospheric and space sciences;
- Whereas, the Parties are interested in setting up NARL observational facilities at places belonging to the University of Kashmir in Srinagar/Gulmarg and other parts of the Jammu & Kashmir state and also in creating a "Cell" for NARL observational facilities in the University of Kashmir, Srinagar.



- Herewith, the Parties agree for a cooperation aiming at measurement of Mesospheric and Thermospheric/Ionospheric (from about 75 to 300 km height region) air glows with airglow photometer/CCD imager at the wavelengths of mainly 557.7nm, 630nm, 840 nm and other ultraviolet, visible and near-infrared spectra at the UoK site in Srinagar, Jammu & Kashmir, India.
- The partners hereby agree as follows:

2. Objectives:

2.1 Establishing collaborative research works in the field of atmospheric, ionospheric and space sciences

Aim: To encourage the scientists of the National Atmospheric Research Laboratory (NARL), Gadanki and the University of Kashmir (UoK), Srinagar in conducting joint research works in various fields of atmospheric/ionospheric processes occurring in the whole height ranges from the boundary layer near the Earth's surface through the middle atmosphere and ionosphere to the magnetosphere and of other planetary atmospheres and their interaction with solar radiations.

2.2 Establishing NARL observational facilities at places belonging to the University of Kashmir in Srinagar/Gulmarg and other parts of the Jammu & Kashmir state

Aim: To facilitate the scientists of NARL and UoK to conduct joint research experiments/observations particularly over the Jammu and Kashmir region to enhance the understanding of the atmospheric dynamics associated with its peculiar climatic and weather conditions (western disturbances, cloud bursts, snow fall and avalanches, melting glaciers etc.) as well as large-scale thermospheric/ionospheric processes travelling through this region to low latitudes initiated over the polar regions due to Joule heating effects of direct impingement of solar high energy radiations and charged particles during solar and geomagnetic storm times.

2.3 Establishing NARL observational facilities cell in the University of Kashmir, Srinagar


Aim: Through this cell, as platform coordinated by NARL and UoK in terms of MoA, scientists of NARL and UoK can approach easily each other and discuss on various modalities of either conducting joint research work or installing observational instruments related to atmospheric/ionospheric studies in Jammu and Kashmir region.



3. Obligations of the Parties:


3.1 NARL

- shall provide the CCD imager and auxiliary hard- and softwares, which are under its possession to UoK on loan basis for a duration of up to three years for the purpose of measuring airglow intensities in the mesosphere and thermosphere/ionosphere region at the wavelengths of initially 557.7nm, 630nm and 840 nm and later at near infra-red and ultra-violet regions;
- provide software for the pre-processing of measured raw spectra and quantitative airglow intensity analysis from resulting calibrated spectra. This software is non-commercial (has been developed at Advanced Photonics, Mumbai through contract from NARL) and UoK is granted to use the software for non-commercial purposes;
- cover costs for shipping, installation & maintenance of the CCD imager in the UoK campus;
- for starting-up this activity, send an expert for the installation and to instruct UoK personnel in the operation of the imager and the analysis of measurements;
- be responsible for the maintenance of the imager. If any technical failure occurs, the standard procedure will be to temporarily ship the device back to either NARL or Advanced Photonics, Mumbai in consultation with NARL for repair;
- not be obliged to ship a replacement in case of permanent inoperability of the imager;
- test the instrumental performance and calibrate further devices of this kind acquired by UoK at a later time before the manufacturer delivers the imager to UoK.
- Provide training to the personnel at UoK for efficient handling and use of the instruments.

3.2 UoK

- will perform regular measurements. It is aimed at performing minimum measurements at least ten days per month during night times (evening 8pm to next day morning 4am) around new moon days. UoK shall be exempted from performing regular measurements if weather conditions do not permit or factors beyond UoK's control;
- store the instrument at an appropriate location, avoiding exposition to rainfall and snowfalls as per the scientific advice of NARL.
- Provide space for housing the instruments ($\sim 1.5 \text{ m} \times 1.5 \text{ m} \times 3 \text{ m}$; length \times breadth \times height) preferably on a rooftop.
- keep an additional safe copy of measured data in an external hard disk drive at the site, which is stored in a different building than the primary dataset building
- UoK will forward all the raw data (recorded intensities and other basic parameters at all the wavelengths) as well as any log files electronically to NARL at least once in the first week of every month;
- UoK will not use the CCD imager and the generated data for commercial purposes, copy, disseminate or otherwise make accessible to third parties the auxiliary software provided by NARL.
- hold available trained personnel or eligible contract person for the operation of the imager;
- inform NARL in due time if any malfunction of the device is noted; NARL will decide whether a shipment back to NARL or Advanced Photonics, Mumbai is required;
- may not use the imager for purposes other than provided for in this Agreement;
- NARL and UoK will jointly identify a team of scientists for the project and smooth operation of the instrument. Members of the team will be offered co-authorship by

default on publications resulting from this joint initiative and others will be considered based on their contribution;

- Make the data resulting from the analysis of recorded airglow intensities (for the wavelengths 557.7nm, 630nm and 840nm) available to the public three years after the measurements have been taken, with the prior written permission from NARL.

4. Other obligations

4.1 Dissemination of the CCD imager or analysis software by UoK to third parties is not allowed without explicit permission of NARL. UoK will not be obliged to buy imager during or after the period of this agreement.


4.2 The ownership of NARL on the CCD imager instrument shall not be affected by its temporary installation / provision to UoK for the purposes under this MoA

4.3 UoK will strive its best for safety of the instrument, however, it will not be held responsible for any damages to the imager for reasons beyond its control such as damages during shipping, lightning, war, rainfall, snowfall etc. In case of instrumental damage caused by UoK by gross negligence or intent, its liability is restricted to the assigned value of the imager (Rupees seventy five Lakhs). In such case, NARL will provide the purchase details of the imager for the evaluation of the actual cost of the imager.

4. As a collaborative atmospheric research project, NARL and UoK together may generate various other joint research proposals for funding in the field of atmospheric/space sciences from DOS/ISRO. In this regard, the UoK shall follow the guidelines of Department of Space for supporting the Sponsored Research projects under its RESPOND Programme.

5. **Principal Investigators (PIs):**

Dr. T. K. Ramkumar (Scientist/Engineer -SF, NARL) and Professor Manzoor A. Malik (Dept. of Physics, University of Kashmir, Srinagar) will be the joint Principal Investigators of the project and are responsible for coordinating the joint research works at the Kashmir University.



6. Intellectual property rights/confidentialities

As the final outcome of scientific results is due to the efforts of joint collaboration between NARL and UoK, the results should not be made available to the public, scientific publishers without prior permission of the other party. When the results in the form of manuscripts are sent for any kind of publications, prior mutual consent of all the authors, co-authors, principal investigators needs to be obtained in writing. Further, until the results are published in properly indexed journals, the content of the manuscripts should not be disclosed in any form to anybody for whatsoever reasons. However, with prior permission of both the parties, deputed scientists involving in analyzing the data can discuss and take help of their colleague scientists in NARL and UoK for various research methodologies, scientific interpretations without affecting the secrecy of important findings.

7. Entry into force/Duration/Termination

7.1 This Agreement shall come into force with effect from *29th October 2016* upon the signatures of both parties and shall be effective until 31.12.2019.

7.2 The Parties may extend the cooperation beyond this period by mutual written consent.

7.3 Both the parties shall have the right to terminate this Agreement at any time by issuing advance notice of three months to the other party on this agreement.

7.4 During the notice period both the parties shall strive to settle amicably the financial and any other technical issues.

7.5 Upon termination of this Agreement, the imager will be shipped back to NARL within four weeks and the cost of shipping will be borne by the party who initiates the early termination. NARL will cover the costs for shipping the imager back after regular termination of this cooperation agreement or in case of a termination strived for by both parties.

8. Amendments of MoA

If any amendments are needed to be done to the MoA in the future, the interesting party can put forth them to the other party well in advance of minimum three months with draft amendments/suggestions. After mutual agreements between NARL and UoK, the MoA can be amended without breaching the norms of intellectual property rights and the confidentialities as mentioned in the para 6 of this MoA and other basic rights of these two parties (NARL, UoK) and the Principal investigators of the present MoA.


9. Financial


10. Arbitration

If any dispute arises between the parties relating to any aspect of this agreement, the same shall be referred to Dr. T. K. Ramkumar, Scientist/Engineer-SF, NARL, Gadanki and Prof. Manzoor Ahmad Malik, Dept. of Physics, Kashmir University and they are authorised to nominate one Arbitrator each (with the approval of Head of their respective institutes). In case of disagreement of the two arbitrators as to the disposal of any referred dispute, the two arbitrators as appointed in accordance with the aforementioned procedure shall appoint a third arbitrator who shall act as an umpire and the matter in dispute shall be decided accordingly by majority. It is mutually agreed that for Jurisdiction either one of these four places in order of preference can be considered: (1) Tirupati (2) Chennai (3) Srinagar and (4) New Delhi.



Memorandum of Agreement Between University of Kashmir and Montana Tech

University of Kashmir and Montana Tech, wishing to enhance cooperation and friendship between the two universities, agree upon the following provisions for academic and educational exchanges:


1. The two universities agree to encourage academic, research, and educational cooperation in fields of mutual interest including:
 - a. Exchange of faculty and/or staff;
 - b. Exchange of graduate and/or undergraduate students;
 - c. Joint bilateral academic meetings;
 - d. Joint research cooperation; and
 - e. Exchange of academic materials and other related information.
2. Each short-term staff visit will require the prior approval of the receiving university that provides reasonable living accommodations and subsistence for the visitor for the duration of the visit. The international travel costs will be the responsibility of the sending University or of the visitor personally. Staff visits for longer periods, such as advanced study or training, will be arranged on terms to be agreed between the two universities in each specific case.
3. Qualified graduate or undergraduate students nominated by one university will be accepted as graduate or undergraduate students by the other university for advanced study, provided the receiving university is satisfied that the students are qualified to pursue the proposed program and the relevant department is able to offer the necessary facilities and supervision.

4. If short-term (1 to 2 terms) exchange students take and finish equivalent courses in the receiving university, the credits they earn can be transferred back, subject to approval of the sending university. The receiving university should issue credits certification.
5. All travel and living expenses will be the responsibility of the sending university or of the students personally. The receiving university reserves the right to charge the normal level of tuition fee unless the two universities agree that the student enrollment is to be included under a balancing exchange arrangement for such student exchanges.
6. Summer camp or summer school for students is encouraged on both sides. The travel and living expenses will be the same as item 5.
7. Both universities agree to expeditiously process all requests submitted under this Agreement and to make every effort to negotiate for terms that are mutually satisfied in all cases.
8. Both universities will encourage joint collaborations and will try jointly to apply for financial support for collaborative research projects from governments as well as private industries.
9. The Agreement will become effective immediately on the date of signature by the designated representatives of both universities and will remain in force for a period of five years from the date of the last signature. The Agreement may be amended or extended by mutual written consent of the two parties.

Whereas, University of Kashmir is a pioneer research institute at state level contributing to the Human Resource Development in the fields of research and education in Jammu & Kashmir. The University is committed to provide an intellectually stimulating environment for productive learning to enhance the educational, economic, scientific, business and cultural environment of the region represented by the Registrar, hereinafter termed as "**University**", which expression shall mean & include its successors, representatives and assigns of the **OTHER PART**.

Whereas CSB is a R&D Institute for the Development of Sericulture Industry in the Country. Under this MOU, the focus is to conduct collaborative research in the project entitled "**Evolution of superior mulberry variety suitable for temperate region through somatic hybridization**", to achieve the objective viz., to produce a superior mulberry variety through the somatic hybridization. the CSR&TI has consulted the University for availing their services and the University has agreed to the proposal of the CSR&TI and accordingly both

the parties have entered into this MOU defining their respective roles and responsibilities in achieving the objective of this collaborative project.

Whereas, the Central Sericultural Research and Training Institute (CSR&TI), Pampore is a pioneer and prestigious Sericultural Research Institute located at Pampore, Jammu & Kashmir State, having an international reputation in the field of Sericultural Research. The Institute has brought out some technologies, products, which have gained popularity among the stakeholders of the Silk Industry. The CSB has authorized the Director, CSR&TI Pampore (J&K) to implement this collaborative project with University of Kashmir as per the project document enclosed to this MOU which forms part and parcel of this MOU.

Whereas, the University of Kashmir, recognizing the importance of scientific cooperation and mutual benefit to be derived from such pursuits of this MOU has offered its services to collaborate with CSR&TI to conduct collaborative research in the project, entitled **"Evolution of superior mulberry variety suitable for temperate region through somatic hybridization"**, to achieve the objective viz., to produce a superior mulberry variety through the somatic hybridization

I. Roles & Responsibilities of CSR&TI, Pampore

CSR&TI, Pampore will work on the following components of this project

1. Ploidy level Identification of selected mulberry varieties
2. Isolation of protoplasts from diploid mulberry varieties
3. Evaluating the viability of isolated protoplasts
4. Protoplasts fusion by Electro cell manipulator
5. Evaluating the viability of fused protoplasts
6. To supply the several explants and fused protoplasts to University of Kashmir to regenerate the plantlets in *in vitro* conditions
7. Certain chemicals and glasswares related to work will be utilized in the University of Kashmir to carry out *in vitro* culture studies.
8. Data collection, compilation and analysis

II. Roles & Responsibilities of University of Kashmir, Hazratbal, Srinagar

In addition of making available the laboratory facilities at Centre of Research for Development, University of Kashmir for the Scientist (Dr.Gulab Khan Rohela) of CSR&TI, Pampore till the project period, the University will work on the following components of the project.

1. Induction of callus from fused protoplasts
2. Somatic embryogenesis
3. Regenerating the plantlets from callus and somatic embryo's
4. Raising the Mulberry plantlets (Somatic Hybrids from the fused protoplasts)
5. Acclimatization of raised plantlets to field conditions through green house phase

General Terms and Conditions:

Article – I Areas of co-operation and collaboration

Prof. Azra Nahaid Kamili, Dean, Biological Science, Professor, Centre of Research & Development, University of Kashmir, Srinagar will carry out the *in vitro* culture studies and will provide the raised somatic hybrids to CSR&TI, Pampore to further carrying out the field level studies.

Article – II Funding

The Budget of 39.90 Lakh allocated for the entire project as detailed in the project document under 'Part-IV-Budget Particulars' will be utilized and accounted by CSR&TI, Pampore in terms of Planning and execution of the project out of the funds allocated to CSR&TI, Pampore under R&D head. No Fund will be provided to the Centre of Research for Development, University of Kashmir. However, the chemicals and materials required for the component of work to be carried out at collaborative institute will be provided by CSR&TI, Pampore.

Article – III Confidentiality

All the information that is gathered from the collaborative work will be treated as the joint property of CSR&TI and University of Kashmir, Srinagar and any utilization of the information / materials will be based on mutual consent.

Article – IV Patent and commercial products

Patenting and commercialization activities from the outcome of the project will be credited equally to both parties.

Article – V Duration, Termination and Modification of MoU

The MoU shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years from the date of execution of the project. This period may be extended by mutual consent of both parties. However, it may be discontinued or amended at any stage based on mutual consent.

Article – VI

Both the parties shall use all their expertise and extend necessary mutual support to implement this project to accomplish its objective in letter and spirit.


Article – VII

There shall be half yearly review of the progress of the project by the Research Council (RC) and Research Advisory Committees (RAC) of CSR&TI, Pampore.

Article – VIII

Any other details required under this MOU which are not specifically provided shall be mutually decided by the parties for necessary incorporation in this MOU.



The Republican State Enterprise «Al-Farabi Kazakh National University» of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan represented by Rector, Academician Galimkair M. Mutanov, on the one part,

and

University of Kashmir represented by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Khurshid Iqbal Andrabi on the other part, (both hereinafter referred to as the Parties collectively, or Party individually),

taking into consideration the partnership and close international relations between the Republic of Kazakhstan and Republic of India.

recognizing the necessity and the possibility for developing further perspective bilateral relations between two countries in educational and scientific fields of cooperation.

wishing to make their own contribution to development of cooperation between two educational institutions in the abovementioned fields,

hereby conclude this Agreement on cooperation (hereinafter referred to as the Agreement) with following provisions.

Article 1

Based on the principle of mutual benefit and respect for each other's independence, the Parties will foster:

1. Mutually beneficial cooperation in, including, but not limited to the following areas: Religious Studies, Cultural Studies
2. Faculty and administrative staff exchange. Organization of training courses for teaching staff. Faculty exchange for conducting jointly organized courses;
3. Student exchange at graduate and undergraduate levels for research internships and training;
4. Development and realization of joint educational programs, curriculum, including programs with double-diploma awarding;
5. Organization of academic meetings and symposia; Joint participation and conduct of scientific and summer schools with the involvement of specialists and students;
6. Joint research activities. Joint participation in the grants awarded by the state, international, public and private foundations and organizations;
7. Publication of articles, reports, and other scientific materials of the university faculty members, staff and students in the periodical publications of the partner-university;
8. Exchange of academic information, publications, materials and knowledge. Organization of access to research centers and facilities to conduct research.
9. Attracting leading scientists and professors for supervising PhD students' research work at the partner-university.
10. Other forms of educational and scientific activities as may be mutually agreed by the two Parties.

In order to give effect to these forms of cooperation, representatives of individual faculties and institutes within the two Parties will be encouraged to consult each other and to develop specific plans for collaboration in any or all of the ways mentioned above.

Article 2

The implementation of each program based upon the Agreement shall be negotiated and agreed upon by the Parties under a separate agreement prior to the initiation of the particular program. This separate agreement will clearly describe the functions and activities to be developed, work schedule, personal profile, financing, rights and obligations of each Party, as well as the required documents necessary to determine the goals and scope of each program.

Article 3

It is implicit that each and every activity undertaken under the Agreement is approved by the appropriate officials at each institution and falls within each institution's academic and fiscal constraints. The results of the cooperative researches including but not limited to any newly produced intellectual rights shall be operated earnestly and fairly through due consultation between the Parties.

Article 4

In the process of implementation of the Agreement's provisions the two universities shall act according to the legislation of their home countries and inter-governmental agreements on cooperation in the fields of education, science and culture between the Republic of Kazakhstan and Republic of India.

All cooperative activities in article 1 above shall be done in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and guidelines of the country and university in which the activity is conducted.

Article 5

The Agreement shall come into effect upon signature of this document by authorized representatives of both universities and shall remain in force until terminated by either university by notification. The notification for termination of the Agreement shall be made not later than six months prior to the termination date. Regardless of termination, the Parties shall continue to fulfill their obligations hereunder until all participants who have commenced the program have completed the term in session at the time of termination. The Agreement may be modified at any time after due consultation between the Parties.

Article 6

The Agreement is created in Russian and English. Four copies of the Agreement shall be made, one to be held by each university, and both shall serve as original.

SCIENTIFIC COOPERATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

The Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes (hereinafter 'EPHE'), of 4-14 rue Ferrus, F-75014 Paris, France, a public scientific, cultural and vocational establishment under French law, represented by its President, Professor Hubert BOST,

on the one hand,

AND

The Centre of Central Asian Studies, University of Kashmir, Hazratbal-190006, Srinagar, Jammu & Kashmir, India, represented by its Registrar, Professor Khurshid Ahmad Butt,

on the other hand,

hereinafter 'the Parties',

IT HAS BEEN AGREED THE FOLLOWING:

Preamble

The purpose of the present Agreement is to foster cooperation in research and teaching between the Parties in all their common fields of competence.

Article 1 - Forms of cooperation

For the purpose of the present Agreement, collaboration between the Parties may include the exchange of students, researchers and faculty members; the exchange of scientific and scholarly publications; the joint organisation of symposia, seminars and conferences as well as the development of joint research programmes and projects.

Article 2 - Procedures and funding

Each Party may, if it so wishes, appoint a scientific coordinator in charge of the implementation and follow-up of the present Agreement.

Each project undertaken in implementation of the present Agreement shall be recorded in a specific annex stating its object, modalities, duration and funding.

The Parties are agreed to facilitate the organisation and funding of activities within the framework of the present Agreement, as the case may be with the support of appropriate third parties.

Article 3 – Intellectual property

Intellectual property created as a result of cooperative activity undertaken by the Parties shall be co-owned by the Parties in proportion of each Party's respective intellectual, financial, human and material contribution to the creation of said intellectual property.

Publication or dissemination of information pertaining to the cooperative activities and the intellectual property resulting from the Parties' cooperative activity shall be subject to the mutual agreement of the Parties and shall explicitly mention the participation of each Party.

Article 4 – Student exchanges

- i) Student exchanges shall be on the basis of full reciprocity between the Parties for the entire duration of the present Agreement.
- ii) The number of exchange students and the duration of each exchange period at the host Party shall be agreed upon by the Parties on a yearly basis.
- iii) Each Party shall select which of its students take part in the exchanges in agreement with the other Party. Exchange students shall remain registered and pay all relevant registration and tuition fees at their home institution; they shall not have to pay any fees to the host Party.
- iv) Exchange students shall choose the lectures and seminars which they want to attend at the host Party, subject to the prior approval of the academic supervisors concerned.
- v) Travelling and accommodation expenses, as well as any other costs as the case may be, shall be at the charge of students taking part in the exchange. Within the limits of its resources the host Party shall make its material facilities available to exchange students, especially for finding accommodation.
- vi) Exchange students must be covered by an appropriate health, accident and third-party liability insurance for the whole duration of their stay at the host Party. If their insurance policy does not afford them full cover in the host country, exchange students must subscribe appropriate additional cover in conformity with the relevant legal provisions of the host country.

Article 5 – Exchange of teaching staff

The Parties hereby undertake to exchange teaching staff members within the limit of available material and financial resources. The selection and formal invitation of teaching staff shall be on the basis of proposals made by the host Party in agreement with the other Party. Invited teaching staff may sit on examination juries of the host Party subject to approval by the relevant authority appointing said juries.

Article 6 – Co-supervision of doctoral theses

The co-supervision of doctoral theses (Ph.D's) shall be encouraged in implementation of the present Agreement, in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations of each country concerned.

A specific co-supervision agreement shall be negotiated by the Parties for each co-supervised doctoral thesis (Ph.D.).

Article 7 – Participation in multilateral programmes

The Parties shall, as much as possible, link their joint cooperation with such multilateral programmes as they deem useful for the purpose of their common objectives.

Article 8 – Entry into force, duration and termination

The present Agreement shall be valid for a period of 5 (five) years. It shall enter into force on the date of its signature by both Parties. Before its date of expiry, the Parties shall jointly decide on the desirability and, as the case may be, the modalities of its renewal.

A Party shall have the possibility of terminating the present Agreement by notifying the other Party in writing not later than December 15, with effect on September 30 of the following year, so as not to disrupt the academic calendar. The termination of present Agreement shall not affect cooperative actions undertaken under the present Agreement which shall be carried out to their agreed term.

Background

The Himalayan University Consortium (HUC) was founded in 2007 with the goal of building a dynamic mountain knowledge partnership among the universities of the HKH region and other organizations and institutions – both within and outside the region – concerned with sustainable mountain development (SMD) in the Hindu Kush Himalayas (HKH)¹ and adjoining mountainous regions. From the outset, the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) has hosted the Secretariat of the HUC and facilitated its activities. The members of the HUC share many common values and concerns regarding opportunities and challenges for research, education and training relating to regional SMD. However, the universities in the HKH vary considerably in many aspects. Some have existed for a century or more, with a wealth of resources such as multidiscipline research centers, experienced scholars and professionals, experience in capacity building, and research and extension capabilities. Others have been established over the past decade. Some universities have long-established collaborative bilateral relationships with universities in Europe or North America; others have no such relationships.

There have been limited interactions and collaboration between HKH universities, even within individual countries. This challenge is exacerbated by the fact that the universities are distributed across a mountainous region that is not easily accessible and has inadequate communications facilities, a problem that is partially being addressed through the application of information and communication technology (ICT).

A major factor behind the slow pace of SMD in the HKH is a lack of professionals who can undertake high-quality research and support sustainable mountain development, and poor international cooperation. There is considerable scope for increasing collaborative activities between academic and research institutions in the HKH and their counterparts in other parts of the world. Such collaboration would promote growth and dissemination of knowledge and help improve livelihoods and economy in the context of SMD.

What HUC Stands For

Vision

To support sustainable mountain development in the HKH, in balance with the interests of surrounding lowlands, and to contribute to global knowledge through collaborative research, education, and training.

¹ Hereafter, in this Charter, HKH will refer to the Hindu Kush Himalayas and adjoining mountainous regions.

Mission

To establish an effective network of universities in the HKH, in collaboration with academic, research and knowledge exchange institutions both within and outside the region, to engage top-notch professionals who can undertake high-quality research, education, teaching, and knowledge dissemination.

Objectives

- 1) To have an effective structure for networking and collaboration at the regional (HKH) and sub-regional level;
- 2) To undertake research and knowledge exchange activities to support SMD in HKH and contribute to global knowledge;
- 3) To collaborate on education and training activities to develop skills, knowledge and human capital to support SMD in the HKH;
- 4) To foster regional collaboration and cooperation on SMD; and
- 5) To link local, regional and global knowledge systems to support SMD in the HKH

Functions

All functions of the HUC will be collaborative, and will include:

- 1) Research on key topics in SMD in the HKH, leading to increased knowledge that informs the other functions, including scholarships and other mechanisms that enable students and/or staff at one HUC member institution to undertake research with/at another;
- 2) Education, including upgrading of existing curricula (from individual modules to entire degrees), joint development and delivery of new courses (e.g., field courses, face-to-face, blended delivery using ICT);
- 3) Training and capacity building, including student and staff exchange, and summer schools and other short courses for diverse audiences, e.g., academic (scientific knowledge and methodologies), managers, policy makers;

- 4) Knowledge dissemination and exchange, including a website, publications for various audiences (e.g., papers for peer-reviewed journals, reports, policy briefs), workshops, and conferences
- 5) Resource mobilization, both in-kind and financial, from members and other sources, to ensure the implementation of the other functions.

Organization and Structure

Approach

The HUC structure comprises its member institutions, secretariat, and a steering group, as well as an open-ended array of focused project teams from the member institutions. The HUC represents a consensual alliance or consortium of organizations with a common vision, not a contracted or legally bound entity.

At present, ICIMOD acts at the secretariat of the HUC, collaborating with HUC members to operate and further develop the HUC. Over time this can be changed and the secretariat may move to other organizations.

HUC Membership

HUC has two membership categories: full members and associate members. There are two membership types within each category.

Full Members

- 1) Universities with mountain-related or oriented curricula from the eight countries that constitute the Hindu Kush Himalayan region;
- 2) Research and/or knowledge organizations in the Hindu Kush Himalayas that share the vision of the HUC.

Associate Members

- 1) Universities from other parts of the world that share the vision of the HUC and have an abiding interest in the HUC and/or have academic programs that match those of HUC

- 2) Research and/or knowledge organizations from other parts of the world that share the vision of the HUC and have an abiding interest in the HUC and/or academic programs that match those of HUC

Universities

'Universities' refer to institutions of higher education that have their own registered students.

Research/Knowledge Organizations

This includes knowledge organizations and research institutions with a focus on mountains and related research.

Membership rights and responsibilities

Membership in the HUC is voluntary, and entails rights and responsibilities for the member. Membership is for three years and is renewable. Each member of the HUC chooses specific individuals to represent them at HUC meetings and on advisory committees, temporary task forces and sharing communities/interest groups.

Participation

Both full members and associate members may participate in and lead the development of HUC consortium activities, and all members have the right to participate in consortium activities.

Eligibility Criteria

While selecting applications for membership, the steering group is guided by the following criteria:

- Demonstrated commitment to the HUC's goals and values and ability to actively contribute to the development of the HUC and its programs.
- Willingness to provide in-kind support, services, or material resources that can aid the operation and development of the HUC including providing access to academic publications.
- Links to major HKH constituencies.

These criteria constitute a checklist, though no applicant for HUC membership is expected to meet them all. These criteria apply to both full members and associate members.

Secretariat

The secretariat is hosted by ICIMOD for the time being. A programme manager heads the secretariat, while one or more full-time programme coordinator/ executive and programme associate/assistant perform the day-to-day work. The secretariat is responsible for administrative and financial operations and has publicity and organizational tasks. The programme manager will participate in HUC activities as member-secretary and will take a proactive role in taking those activities forward, which includes providing technical assistance to the steering groups, advisory committees, task forces and sharing communities/interest groups. The secretariat will also be responsible for planning and executing the annual meeting. Members may contribute short-term staff to the HUC to carry out administrative or research work sponsored by the HUC or its partners. The secretariat is the first point of contact for potential new members.

Tasks for the Secretariat are:

- 1) Establish task forces or focused project teams to accomplish activities specified in the Action Plan;
- 2) Coordinate the work of the advisory committees, task forces, and interest groups, including evaluation of initiatives and projects;
- 3) Prepare practice, programs, and services for approval by Steering Group during at the annual meeting;
- 4) Monitor and evaluate the progress of approved initiatives and projects;
- 5) Facilitate communications at all levels between committees, and with organizations supporting the work of the HUC both in the region and outside.

Steering Group***Role***

The steering group (SG) develops and recommends the strategic plan and major initiatives for the Consortium, and oversees the implementation of the strategic goals set by the annual meeting and the work of the focused project teams /committees.

The SG develops and directs the annual work plan of the consortium, including a clear timeframe for starting and completing each project undertaken by the team/ committee.

Representation

The steering group shall include:

- three representatives from the full member institutions
- one representative from the associate member institutions
- one representative from the member institution as the host of the secretariat - a member secretary
- The chairperson will be elected from among the steering group members on an annual basis. Each SG member is elected for a three-year term, which can be renewed once. Elections take place during the HUC annual meeting after the SG outlines a process for nominating candidates. Interested candidates are requested to express their wish to be nominated two months ahead of the Annual Meeting.

Tasks

The steering group shall provide guidance and approve proposals, documents on procedures and action plans prepared by the Secretariat and task force/groups The Steering Group shall also perform the following tasks:

- 1) Approve an updated strategic plan and a list of major initiatives to be pursued, and propose them at the annual meeting;
- 2) Make recommendations on policy to General Body's approval;
- 3) Provide inputs in identifying new areas for collaboration and opportunities for resource mobilization;
- 4) Recommend new members to General Body for approval.
- 5) Formulate procedures for implementation of the Charter.

Advisory Committees, Task Forces, and Interest Groups

The steering group may appoint standing advisory committees, temporary task forces and sharing communities/Interest groups to facilitate communication and the work of the consortium. Members will typically, though not universally, include a representative from each of the partner universities. Each advisory committee includes a steering group representative who acts as a liaison between the advisory committee and the steering group.

Processes

The steering group will conduct meetings, either face to face or via Skype/video, at least twice a year.

Priorities, operations, project selection, finance, and other ad hoc items will be reviewed. Planning for specific focused annual meetings, including meeting location, timing, agenda, and documentation, will be coordinated by the secretariat with facilitative oversight from the steering group.

Resources

All transactions both in kind and financial and utilization will be fully transparent. In specific settings, resources may also be developed through international donors or professional society funding or grants.

Annual Meeting



University of Kashmir through its Registrar, Prof. Musadiq A. Sahar (Hereinafter referred to as the **First Party** which expression shall include his successors in office during the operation of the Agreement including the time of extension, if any made in this behalf.)

AND

through its authorised officer namely: **A.K.Mishra**
Designation: **Managing Director**

[Hereinafter referred to as the **Second Party** which expression shall include its successive officers in office/s during the operation of this Agreement or till such other time as may be expressly extended to for operation of this Agreement.]

Whereas, the University of Kashmir is ordained to provide for instruction in such branches of learning as it may think fit and to make provision for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge and is further empowered to do all such acts and things which it deems desirable to cultivate and promote arts, science and other branches of learning.

Whereas the students especially from Kashmir and Ladakh Divisions of the State have to incur huge expenditure outside the state for purposes of coaching to compete in wide variety of competitive examinations like IAS, KAS.

Whereas, various students and parents of students have been requesting for University's role to facilitate its academic expertise, guidance and counselling, so that the students compete fairly in various job oriented and professional examinations conducted both at the State and National level from time to time.

Whereas, the University with the above sacred statutory objective to avoid waste of their time, energy and money, after a thoughtful consideration has resolved to open its doors to a larger section of the students so as to excel their prospects for competing in competitive examinations of wide variety of professional courses and jobs both at State and National level for which no coaching guidance and counselling avenues are available within the state especially in Kashmir Valley has resolved to start coaching for the afore mentioned examinations.

AND

Whereas, the second party is a Private Institute of National repute with expertise shall conduct the coaching for the aforementioned examinations and the two parties have resolved to join their hands to achieve the aforementioned objectives on the terms and conditions expressly agreed to as contained herein below in this Agreement.

NOW THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITNESETH AS UNDER:

01. This MOA shall remain in operation for a period of three years or till such other time as the two parties shall expressly agree to extend its operation.
- 02: The **Second Party** shall undertake the coaching for civil services examination through the Director, Centre of Career Planning and Counselling of University of Kashmir at such time/dates/places as specified and mutually agreed to by both the parties from time to time. The **Second Party** shall in no case use the name of University of Kashmir in conferment of any certificates etc in this behalf.


03. The **Second Party** shall provide Test Paper with a set of 10 test series exactly in the pattern of Civil Services Examination.
04. The **First Party** shall facilitate the infrastructure/ space for the conduct of coaching with the requisite accessories including heating/cooling arrangements as the case may be and such other services as may be agreed to by the parties.
05. The applications from the applicants for the coaching shall be invited by the **First Party** in accordance with its settled academic procedures and the list of the selected candidates shall be maintained in the office of the Director Centre for Career Planning and Counselling. The amount of fee to be charged and paid by the selected candidates shall be such as is mutually agreed by the parties and such fee may also be varied at different times and circumstances.
06. Over and above the agreed intake of candidates in a programme, ten candidates from the selected / short listed candidates shall be provided fee waiver option on the basis of following criteria.
 - i) 5 candidates on the basis of merit.
 - ii) 5 candidates on the basis of merit cum means.
07. Keeping in view the UGC mandate and availability of funding from UGC and other agencies for under privileged class, the coaching centre shall conduct coaching programme for such candidates in accordance with the terms and conditions of UGC/funding agencies in this behalf and such programme shall be conducted subject to such terms.
08. The admission fee charged from the candidates as agreed by the parties shall be deposited as demand draft (DD) in favour of Director, Centre for Career Planning & Counselling (CCPC), University of Kashmir.

09. Sharing of finances generated from the admission fee of the candidates shall be in the proportion of 35% **First Party** (University of Kashmir) and 65% **Second Party** (Chanakya IAS Academy) as mutually agreed.
- * Expenditure on advertisements, banners and other connected / incidental expenses in this regard will be borne by the parties to this MOA in the ratio of 35% **First Party** (University of Kashmir) and 65% **Second Party** (Chanakya IAS Academy).
 - * Air Fare to the Faculty and the employee if any of the **Second Party** involved in the programme from Delhi to Srinagar and back will be borne by the **Second Party**.
10. The **First Party** through its Officer – the Director Centre for Career Planning and Counselling shall be responsible to provide/ pay following facilities/ expenditures to the **Second Party**:
- * University transport to be provided to resource persons from Srinagar Airport to University Campus and back.
 - * Fixed menu, boarding and lodging (free accommodation) in the University Guest House/s to resource persons.
11. It shall be sole responsibility of **Second Party** to deliver quality coaching in terms of subject experts, study material and regular assessments / Test series, etc.
12. The University will act as super ordinate authority and through its Dean Academic Affairs would exercise academic control over the coaching to ensure that quality coaching is imparted. Accordingly if there is any well founded complaint against the affairs of coaching or any teacher/candidates, the Dean Academic Affairs would issue orders for the appropriate redressal.

13. In case of any dispute arising out of this Agreement or its terms and conditions, the parties shall be bound to refer the dispute to the sole arbitration of a person to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor, University of Kashmir. The decision of the said arbitrator shall be final and binding. Legal actions, if any shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Courts at Srinagar.



Memorandum of Understanding

Srinagar, India – Novosibirsk, Russia

The Parties:

The Federal State Budgetary Institution of Science **the Institute of Archaeology and Ethnography, Siberian Branch of the Russian Academy of Sciences (IAET SB RAS, Novosibirsk)**, duly represented by its Director, **Dr. M. V. Shunkov**, and the **Centre of Central Asian Studies, University of Kashmir, Srinagar, India**, duly represented by its Director, **Prof. G.N. Khaki**, hereinafter collectively referred to as "**Parties**", with the purpose to undertake joint research in the fields of archaeology and reconstruction of issues regarding human migrations in Central Asia, have entered into this Agreement in respect of the following:

1. SUBJECT OF AGREEMENT

1.1. The Parties will give research priority to the interdisciplinary archaeological studies of Kashmir archaeological sites and analytical studies in research laboratories of the Siberian Branch of the Russian Academy of Sciences.

2. LIABILITIES OF THE PARTIES

2.1. The Parties undertake to:

2.1.1. Carry out joint archaeological studies and analytical research based on laboratory facilities and equipment available for the Parties.

2.1.2. Carry out duplicate studies for some key results with the purpose to obtain unbiased scientific information.

2.1.3. Publish the obtained scientific data under joint authorship and negotiate the team of contributors with the project managers on the basis of a full consensus.

2.1.4. Encourage prompt publication of obtained data in specialized scientific literature issued both in the countries represented by the Parties and in the third countries.

2.1.5. Provide full support and assistance to young scientists participating in the project.

2.2. IAET SB RAST undertakes to:

2.2.1. Facilitate researchers participating in this Agreement to collect samples in the field.

2.2.2. Carry out a set of necessary anthropological studies within this project, participating in discussions of the summarized results and their subsequent publication.

2.2.3. Carry out archaeological studies within this project, participating in discussions of the summarized results and their subsequent publication.

2.3. The Centre of Central Asian Studies undertakes to:

2.3.1. Carry out field and analytical studies, participate in discussions of summarized results, their subsequent publication and the list of co-authors and seeking consensus in all these issues.

3. DURATION

3.1. The following persons are appointed as the principal investigators of the Agreement:

On the part of IAET SB RAS: **Prof. N.V. Polosmak.**

On the part of the Centre of Central Asian Studies: **Dr. Mohammad Ajmal Shah.**

3.2. This Agreement will come into force on the day of its conclusion and signing by both Parties and remains valid for the term of the three consecutive years. The provisions of this Agreement will be binding for the next five years upon the termination of the Agreement in case of pending publications on the issues in question.

3.3. This Agreement is executed in two copies in Russian and English languages; each copy is equally valid and binding.

3.4. The Agreement does not imply any exclusive relationships between the Parties that prevent the Parties from entering into agreements with third parties and carrying out their own activity similar to that specified in the present Agreement.

3.5. All legal and financial responsibilities of the Parties occurred on the basis of special agreements as appendixes to the present Agreement.



Tajik National University, Dushanbe, Republic of Tajikistan

on mutual cooperation and exchange in field of scientific knowledge and research for the academic excellence

The University of Kashmir, Srinagar, Republic of India and National University of Tajikistan, Dushanbe, Republic of Tajikistan sign this memorandum of Understanding (MOU) hereinafter referred to as the "participants" have reached the following understanding:

(A) Areas of Collaboration

I. Academic Collaboration:


- The two universities shall collaborate and support each other academically by conducting joint academic activities for the smooth and effective management of their respective departments/centres/courses.
- Collaboration shall be encouraged between various teaching departments/centres/institutes of two universities to help each other mutually for carrying out academic activities effectively.

II. Research Collaboration:

- The two universities shall collaborate with each other to undertake Joint Research Projects and allow joint supervision of research programs (M.Phil/Ph.D)
- The two universities shall conduct conferences/workshops/seminars jointly where faculty members from both universities would be encouraged to participate.

III. Faculty Exchange:

- The two universities shall encourage/support faculty exchange programs that are mutually beneficial and helpful for faculty members in pursuing their courses/work smoothly and effectively.



- The two universities shall sponsor visits by faculty members for a period of one month up to three months for interaction with teachers/scholars/delivering extension lectures according to the details that will be mutually agreed upon.

IV. Student Exchange:

- The two Universities shall encourage/support exchange programmes for research Scholars to enable them to use superior infrastructural facilities available in each other's universities and to interact/learn from experienced well trained faculties at two Universities.
- The two Universities shall allow scholars/students to attend classes/seminars in each others' Universities according to details that will be mutually agreed upon.

V. Training:

- The two Universities shall co-operate/support each other for providing training to the faculty/administrative staff for improving their academic/administrative capabilities.

(B) Universities Obligations

Two Universities agree to cooperate and support each other for implementing this MOU successfully. Both universities shall:

1. Provide access to faculty/students to their libraries, archives, research laboratories and other facilities.
2. Provide access to high end instruments and equipments to each other's faculty/scholars/students as and when desired.
3. Encourage faculty/scholars/students to visit each other's Universities for conducting research/talent promotion programmes / other academic activities.
4. Share knowledge/information and publications/magazines/literature essential for the academic pursuit.
5. Provide accommodation to the visiting faculty members/scholars at subsidised rates on the university campus as and when required.
6. Allow utilization of service of each other's Scholars/students for undertaking field survey, investigations and experiments.



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(C) Operationalization of the MoU

1. In order to develop concrete based this MoU, joint meetings/ workshops will be organised at the regular intervals at Srinagar, Jammu & Kashmir, India and Dushanbe, Tajikistan.
2. If any of the visiting student/scholar or faculty member commits any kind of impropriety at the host institute during the period of his/her visit, the facilities offered to him/her shall be immediately withdrawn and he/she shall be sent back to his/her parent institution. A report regarding this impropriety committed by the concerned shall be forwarded to his/her parent institution for initiating necessary disciplinary action according to local / international rules.
3. This MoU shall remain effective from the date it is signed by the University of Kashmir, Srinagar, Jammu & Kashmir, India and National University of Tajikistan, Dushanbe, Tajikistan. This MoU shall remain in force for a period of five years and further extension shall be subject to review unless terminated by either party by giving a written notice of its intention at least three months in advance to the other party.





**MoU specifying the Responsibilities and Obligations of the University of Kashmir (KU), the
Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) and the South Asia Foundation-India (SAF)**

1. Responsibilities/ Obligations of the University of Kashmir:

- 1.1 Sign the MoU with the Jamia Millia Islamia to operationalize the joint Masters programme and also take urgent steps to process the proposal with the concerned authorities of the University.
- 1.2 Agree that semesters 1 and 3 would be taught at the Kashmir University and that the semesters 2 and 4 would be taught at the Jamia Millia Islamia.
- 1.3 Put the admission procedures in place before the proposed programme commences, in consultation with SAF-India and Jamia Millia Islamia.
- 1.4 Hold consultations with the officials of the Jamia Millia Islamia to work out the admission/ screening procedures of the students jointly with JMI.
- 1.5 Select not more than 16 SAF scholars, 2 each from the 8 SAF chapters based on gender equality.
- 1.6 The total intake of students for the Masters programme at UMIKS not to exceed 30 in all with the number of non-SAF scholars limited to 14.
- 1.7 In the scholar selection if a Chapter is un-represented, the place would remain vacant.
- 1.8 The syllabus for the 1st and 3rd semesters for the said Master's programme will be designed by the University of Kashmir.

- 1.9 Designate a Nodal Officer at KU who would coordinate the programme within the university, with the Jamia Millia Islamia and SAF-India.
- 1.10 Agree to award the MA Degree jointly with JMI, and, if any approvals are required for the purpose from any external agencies like the UGC, etc., obtain such approvals before the programme commences.
- 1.11 Make sure no delays occur in awarding the joint Degree to scholars who successfully complete the programme.

2. Responsibilities/ Obligations of the Jamia Millia Islamia


- 2.1 Sign the MoU with the University of Kashmir to operationalize the joint Masters programme.
- 2.2 Agree to conduct semesters 2 & 4 at JMI for UMIKS students.
- 2.3 Agree to award the MA Degree jointly with UK, and, if any approvals are required for the purpose from any external agencies like the UGC, etc., obtain such approvals before the programme commences.
- 2.4 Involve themselves in the admission process along with the Kashmir University after due consultations with SAF-India and the officials of KU.
- 2.5 Be responsible for the discipline and security of the UMIKS scholars during their stay at Jamia Millia Islamia.
- 2.6 Provide guest house / hostel accommodation of UMIKS students within the JMI campus not exceeding 30 in all.
- 2.7 Strictly adhere to the time schedule of the 2 semester study programme.
- 2.8 Make sure no delays occur in sending the evaluations and other necessary details upon completion of second and fourth semesters at Jamia Millia Islamia to University of Kashmir, in order to ensure timely award of the joint Degree to scholars who successfully complete the programme.


- 2.9 Jamia Millia Islamia besides designing core courses will provide a list of optional courses in related disciplines to be offered at the 2nd and 4th semesters under its Choice Based Credit Transfer System.


3. Responsibilities and Obligations of South Asia Foundation-India (SAF-India)


- 3.1 Provide coordinating role in the implementation of the Masters Programme while adhering to the principle of non interference in the academic processes.
- 3.2 Make commitment to the University of Kashmir and Jamia Millia Islamia that SAF-India would be responsible, from within the allocated scholarship funds to UMIKS, for the expenses on travel and accommodation of UMIKS students during the 2 semester study at Jamia Millia Islamia.
- 3.3 Be responsible to pay the guest house/ hostel accommodation charges of the UMIKS students to the JMI directly from the scholarship funds allocated to UMIKS.
- 3.4 Be responsible to pay honorarium/ remuneration and local transport expenses to the resource persons engaged in the teaching of core papers as per mutually agreed rates.
- 3.5 The total amount of expenses shall be calculated on the basis of actuals taking into account the per capita expenditure of the previous year. The total expenses cannot, in any case, exceed the allotted sum of US\$200,000 (for the 16 scholars from the SAARC countries including two Indians- a boy and a girl- registered for 2015-16)

Whereas the parties to this MOU intend to give this MOU a legal shape and are desirous to put the terms and conditions thereof into writing.



2. Responsibilities of University of Kashmir:


- a) To provide power with DG backup and space for exchange free of cost.
- b) To maintain the campus telephone network and allied instruments.
- c) To monitor the functioning of Exchange system by technical staff of the University telephone wing under the supervision of concerned Jr. Engineer, Telecom of the University besides campus field network.
- d) Provide free right of way to the OFC/cables etc., for connectivity of the BSNL equipment, etc.
- e) To provide safety measures of the campus field telephone network and allied instruments against hazardous voltages which in any case are likely to cause damage to the equipments etc.

3. Financial implications:

- i. One time security deposit @ Rs. 500/= per connection.
- ii. Monthly rent @ Rs. 195/= per connection plus usual call charges and 50 outgoing calls free of charge per month.
- iii. Monthly rent @ Rs. 140/= per connection without outgoing facility.
- iv. Upto 100 connections, 03 lines will be rent free and for every additional 100 connections 01 additional connection, in addition to above, shall be rent free.

4. Amendment to the Agreement:

The obligations of the University of Kashmir and BSNL Srinagar, Kashmir have been outlined in this agreement. However, during the operation of the agreement, circumstances may arise which call for alteration or modification of this agreement. These alterations/

5. Amicable settlement of disputes and differences:







Whereas the Director intends to open a Library Extension Counter at the **Allama Iqbal Library, Kashmir University**, for the purpose of library services comprising Braille Books and recorded books on CDs and Cassettes being produced at the NIVH to the visually impaired persons. It will be incumbent on the **University Librarian** to enroll all the visually impaired persons of their centre as members of the Braille and Talking Book Library on the terms & condition as applicable in NIVH.
2. The **University Librarian** will also actively enroll other blind persons as members of the Library from and around state of J&K. The Director shall provide the set of terms and conditions as applicable in NIVH to the **University Librarian**.

- 3 Whereas the **University Librarian** has agreed to start the Library Extension Counter at the Allama Iqbal Library, Kashmir University, for the above mentioned purposes. They have also agreed to provide sufficient space and other essential amenities for setting up the Library Extension Counter and Talking Book Library in their premises.
4. Whereas the Director has agreed to provide one time financial assistance of Rs ~~50,000/-~~ ^{25,000/-} for the purchase of furniture and storage and annual contribution of 5,000/- has been agreed towards packing and other contingencies.
5. Whereas the Director shall supply Braille / Talking books to the **University Librarian**. The **University Librarian** shall arrange distribution of the same to the visually impaired persons.
6. The **University Librarian** shall make his / her own arrangement for clerical assistance in running the extension Braille and Talking Book Library Service for keeping the records of books, CD's & members of the Library etc.

7. The Director reserves the right to discontinue the supply books & CD's to Extension Counter in case of default or for any other reason and the **University Librarian** shall have no right to question the decision of the Director. Further the furniture or any other material procured by the **University Librarian** out of the financial assistance provided by the Director shall be the property of the Director, and the Director shall have powers to dispose of the same in any manner as he/ she deems fit.
8. The Extension Counter shall function under the administrative control of the **University Librarian** or his nominee. But the overall responsibility will be of the **University Librarian**.
9. Any person engaged in the Extension Counter for any purpose by the **University Librarian**, shall have no right for employment etc. at the Extension Counter or at NIVH or at any other place under the control of the Director.
10. The person engaged by the **University Librarian** at the Extension Library counter for lending books will be paid a fixed commission or a token honorarium on mutually agreed terms and with the approval of the Executive Council of National Institute for the Visually Handicapped.
