In all the PG programmes there is a given quota under the self-financing scheme. The University started a completely self-financed supplementary shift under which 1275 students were admitted in year 2016-17 to improve campus vibrancy, make adequate use of infrastructure and provide opportunity to additional students to have access to higher studies.

For all the PG programmes implementation of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in letter and spirit marked a major shift towards academic flexibility in the University. The CBCS was also implemented at the UG level.

To bring in diversity and flexibility in the basket of courses for the students to choose from, under the CBCS system a master's student is required to complete 12 core courses worth 4 credits each with each semester covering 3 core courses. Besides, there is a diverse basket of Discipline-centric Elective Courses and Open Elective Courses that students can choose from to complete the required 96 credits for the master's programme. A maximum of 6 Credits in a semester are to be obtained from the Discipline Centric Courses of the Department. A student is also required to obtain at least 2 credits in a semester from the Open and/or Generic Courses offered by Departments other than the candidate's parent department. A student can obtain the Generic and/or Open Electives from any of the Departments of the University/ Satellite Campuses/ P.G centres. The CBCS also provides ample room for tutorials and project work. Besides, the integrated Ph.D system was introduced to do away with the traditional M.Phil degree system.
